Former Mountain View Golf Course Attracts Homeless

The Mountain View Golf Course operated for 45 years until it closed in 2009 due to the economy. The land has sat vacant ever since and is currently attracting homeless encampments near Serfas Club Drive and throughout the former fairways.

- The owners provided a “no trespass” order to the Riverside County Sheriff’s Dept., allowing deputies to enforce trespassing laws on the property.
- More than **50 calls** were made to the sheriff over the last 6 months due to the illegal activities on the course and directly adjacent streets.



The owners are coordinating with Riverside County Code Enforcement and Homeless Outreach Team to organize a “sweep” to relocate trespassers, connect individuals with social services, make arrests as needed, and remove trash.

Repurposing the Site Improves Safety, Increases Property Values



Repurposing the former Mountain View Golf Course will provide a safe, secure and well-maintained environment to deter illegal dumping and trespassing.

The owners are preparing to bring new purpose and neighborhood amenities to the site, through a master-planned community, called The Trails at Corona.

New homes will provide funding to create and maintain trails and open space for the community.
